
Word Portraits \$10.00 of America's Founders


From slaveholders like Washington and Jefferson to abolitionists like Benjamin Rush and John Jay, slavery presented the creators of the American republic with a profound dilemma and an inextricable contradiction. This collection of primary sources (with illuminating introductions) describes the transformation of white America's attitudes about slavery from the idealistic beginnings of the Revolution to the harsh realities of postwar depression and nation-building. Poignant stories describe how runaway slaves often voluntarily returned to their masters for limited periods of indenture, fearing that the Constitution's fugitive slave clause would legally force them back into permanent slavery.
